- 6) Tell someone in your family about what Jesus has done for you in his birth, death and resurrection!

- 1) Read John 6-10 and specifically look for where people were joyful and why.
- 2) Sing the 3 songs that we talked about at the end of tonight, either by yourself or with someone else.
- 3) Ask yourself: How am I known by my joy in God?
- 4) What does the joy of God make you want to do?
- 5) Who is someone that we know, that is excited about the gospel? And what do you think about that person?
- 6) How do people in the Old Testament rejoicing point to Jesus?
- 7) Why is reading the Bible important?
