

Family Discipleship Questions

HGW – W1 – 3/25/2020 “What does this passage say?”

- 1) Ask your student to summarize the entire chapter in 2-3 sentences
- 2) What type of psalm is this – why is this important?
- 3) Who wrote this psalm? The Sons of Korah or Moses or David or Asaph? [Why is this important?]
- 4) What do the different stanzas tell us about God?
- 5) What about this passage is confusing to you?

HGW – W2 – 4/1/2020 “What did this passage mean to its original audience?”

- 1) Why did John write the gospel of John? (John 20)
- 2) What does the word context mean? Why is it important?
- 3) Why is the context for psalm 19 harder to figure out than Hosea or Luke?
- 4) Who was the audience for Psalm 19? What were the Israelites struggling with?
- 5) What did this passage mean to the original audience?
- 6) Memorize Psalm 19:1-4 this week and DM a video of you doing so to the RSM Instagram!

HGW – W3 – 4/15/2020 “What does this passage tell me about God”

- 1) All the phrases about the Word of God in verses 7-9 end with an active verb (The Law of the Lord is perfect **reviving** the soul). How does this relate to Hebrews 4:12?
- 2) Reread the chapter on your own, and apart from what we just talked about, what does this passage teach us about God?
- 3) How is verse 6 a metaphor about God (like the Sun)?
- 4) What does God’s creation say about God? What does the Word of God say about God?
- 5) Why is knowing God, as He has made himself known in his Word, important?

HGW – W4 – 4/22/2020 “What does this passage tell me about man?”

- 1) [Adoration of God] – Read **1 John 1:1-5** and **Hebrews 4:14-16** and **tell one other person** what you learned about God from these verses. **Then pray together with that person praising God for what you talked about.**
- 2) [Confession of sins]
 - a. Hidden sins – Because sin has skewed our view of ourselves and our view of God, we don’t always know when we sin against God in the act, attitude, or nature. Like David, **pray** that God would declare you innocent from unknown sins because He has the power to do that as Lord overall.
 - b. Presumptuous sins – Our direct choosing of sin (pride, idolatry, lust, comparison, etc.) over God makes sin the lord of our lives rather than God. **Read Colossians 3:12-17.** And **write down all the ways that you have fallen short** and are in desperate need of God.
- 3) [Adoration of God] – Reread **Colossians 3:12-17** and **Praise God in prayer** that He has fulfilled everything written in these verses and more! **Praise God in prayer** that He has made

us innocent because of Jesus!

HGW – W5 – 4/29/20 “What does this passage demand of me?”

- 1) When we think about studying the Bible what are the first three things that come to mind? What does this tell us about our view of God’s Word?
- 2) Why should we apply the Word of God to our lives? (James 2:14-26)
- 3) What does David do in response to the demand of the passage? AKA What does David’s theology (the study of God) lead him to do?
- 4) What does the passage demand (command or compel) YOU to do?
